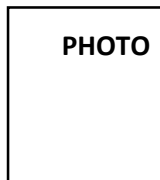

The Curriculum:

National College of Pharmacy is affiliated to Kerala University of Health Sciences, KUHS and follows the syllabus prescribed by Pharmacy Council of India, PCI. The medium of instruction is English. Add-on courses and

value added courses are incorporated into the curriculum to address the gaps identified in the syllabus.

Admission Procedure:

Admissions are made by the KMCT head office based on the norms of selection and availability of seats.

B.Pharm: Admission to the B.Pharm program requires candidates to have passed the Higher Secondary Examination, Kerala, or its equivalent, with 50% marks in Biology/Mathematics and 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry, and Biology/Mathematics combined. For lateral entry into the second year (Third semester) of the B.Pharm program, candidates should have passed the Diploma in Pharmacy course from an institution approved by the All India Council for Technical Education, Pharmacy Council of India, with a minimum of 50% marks in the final year examinations.

M.Pharm: For admission to M.Pharm program, candidates must have passed the B.Pharm degree examination from an Indian university recognized by the Pharmacy Council of India, with a minimum of 55% aggregate marks over four years. Admission requires registration with the State Pharmacy Council within one month from admission.

Pharm.D: For admission to Pharm.D program, candidates must have passed one of the following examinations: 10+2 examination with Physics and Chemistry as compulsory subjects along with Mathematics or Biology, with a minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate for optional subjects or a pass in the D.Pharm course with a minimum of 50% marks from an institution approved by the Pharmacy Council of India.

Candidates must also have completed 17 years of age by December 31st of the year of admission.

Selection to BPharm, Pharm D and M Pharm programs are strictly based on merit, as determined by the competent authority approved by the Government of Kerala/Kerala University of Health Sciences. The number of seats is as prescribed by the Kerala University of Health Sciences.

Fee payment mode:

Annual fees should be paid at the time of admission to new classes. The office will oversee the collection of tuition fees from students. Students must make their tuition fee payments to the college's official bank account, which is held at Union Bank of India, Manassery branch. Alternatively, students may opt to use a demand draft for payment. They are required to share a screenshot of the payment as proof of transaction. For those students availing hostel facility, hostel fees should be paid along with the tuition fees.

Conveyance:

The college is presently having 3 buses for transportation of students and staff. Buses are operated regularly on all working days of the college with convenient timings. In addition to daily trips, buses are made available to all academic /extracurricular tour /trips of students and staff.

The college bus facility is monitored by the bus coordinators.

College Uniform:

In accordance with the college dress code for students, a standardized gender neutral uniform has been established to foster a sense of professionalism and unity.

B Pharm: Light blue shirt with long sleeves, black trousers and black blazer

Pharm D: Light pink shirt with long sleeves, black trousers and black blazer

D Pharm: Light yellow blue shirt with long sleeves, black trousers and black blazer

Students are required to neatly tuck in the shirt paired with black trousers featuring a formal fit worn at the waist. During lab hours, it is mandatory to wear white apron. Additionally, the college identification card must be visibly displayed at all times and worn around the neck or securely attached to clothing. Footwear should consist of polished shoes, emphasizing a clean and professional appearance. Deviations from the prescribed uniform may result in disciplinary action, as students are expected to present themselves in a neat and tidy manner, reflecting the values and standards upheld by the college.

Evaluation and Assessment:

B Pharm: 2 Internal Examinations and 1 University Examination in each semester

Pharm D: 3 Internal Examinations and 1 University Examination in each year

M Pharm: 2 Internal Examinations and 1 University Examination in each semester

Examination Committee (EC) coordinates the smooth conduct of internal/external examinations. The EC prepares the examination schedule based on academic calendar. The EC appoints invigilators to monitor the fair conduct of internal examination. The results of the internal assessment are displayed in the notice board and in the “campus medicine” (academic management system exclusively developed for NCP) which can be accessed by Principal, HOD's, students and parents with their login ID. Students attending not less than 80% of the classes and securing not less than 50% in internal examinations both in theory and in practical separately in each subject shall be eligible for appearing university examination.

The University examinations are carried out as per the specifications of the University. The invigilators for external examinations are appointed by EC as per university guidelines. Evaluation of University Practical Examination is done by two examiners, one internal and external as appointed by the University. All theory examinations are conducted under CCTV surveillance.

Library:

NCP library is automated with digital facilities through the Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) and provides sufficient

subscriptions to e-resources journals for the benefit of both faculty and students. The library has a vast collection of books, journals, magazines, periodicals and e-resources. Total number of books in our library is around 10000. The library has ample reading space with additional reading rooms. The library is installed with Integrated Library Management System for the smooth working of the library that includes accession, issue return, data generation, and stock verification. The library has KOHA-OPAC in which students & faculty can search books by title/ author name etc.

A separate well equipped Digital library is made available with e-journals and e-book subscriptions. The library offers an e-content digital library with internet connectivity and holds active subscriptions with EBSCO and DELNET, granting access to approximately 1000 e-journals and a variety of e-books spanning various subjects. Institutional repository software D Space (Version6.3) is made available in the library. Institutional resources like study materials, references, previous years' question papers, students 'project/dissertation are made available to the users through D-Space. The publications of all faculty and students can be accessed via D-Space. Apart from EBSCO and DELNET institution has subscription to various national and international journals. 15 computer terminals with the latest software and free internet facility are available for student use.

Mentor-Mentee system:

The mentorship program at National College of Pharmacy is designed to monitor and foster the all-round development of students. Mentees may encounter a range of problems, from behavioral and attitudinal issues to academic and professional performance concerns, but the mentors are equipped to take stock of all issues faced by students and help resolve them.

Mentor-Mentee system is implemented to provide one-to-one care and all-round guidance to our students, with mentors serving as Teacher-Guardians to the students. This system helps in improving retention rates, enhancing job placement opportunities, and promoting alumni engagement. To achieve this, each student is assigned with a mentor who is a teacher of the same institution and is responsible for guiding them throughout their academic journey. The mentors provide supportive and purposeful counseling to assist students in finding their own path forward. Parents and students are encouraged to discuss any concerns they have with their assigned mentor. Regular mentor-mentee meetings are scheduled, providing students with an opportunity to discuss both academic and personal issues. Finally, Mentor feedback reports are submitted to the Principal to ensure continuous improvement in our mentorship program.

GPAT coaching:

GPAT is a nationwide examination conducted by The All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi. Students who pass the GPAT examination and have a Bachelor's Degree in Pharmacy are eligible to receive scholarships when admitted to any AICTE affiliated Institute for the Master's Program.

The institution offers specialized coaching classes for GPAT Exam, starting from the third year of the Bachelor's program. Trained faculty members provide students with tailored advice to help them excel in their GPAT and gain admission to the top institutions in India. A unique teaching methodology is adopted which includes extensive concept building, problem solving, regular assessments, and feedback, that is designed to benefit all students. Interested students can enroll for GPAT coaching program that will be conducted without affecting the regular class hours.

Campus Medicine:

Campus medicine is a portal aimed at establishing smooth communication among teachers, students and parents. The portal has a wide range of portfolios like student record maintenance, timetable, attendance, internal marks and parent communication. The website is periodically updated.

Arts and Sports:

The Sports fest, Aura and Arts fest, Nadam are conducted systematically every year. Students are encouraged to participate in extra –curricular activities. Campus houses an auditorium, equipped with a cutting-edge light and sound system that transforms every performance into a mesmerizing spectacle.

The college sports complex offers a diverse array of facilities to engage in mind-stimulating games like chess and carroms, as well as hone their cricket skills in dedicated practice nets. For those seeking physical activity, there's a well-equipped badminton court and a gym facility stocked with modern exercise equipment. Students also have access to multiple courts for basketball and football, providing ample opportunities for team sports and friendly competitions.

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CODE OF CONDUCT:

- All students must arrive on time for class and stay until dismissed, as tardiness and early departures are disruptive and disrespectful.
- Without an ID card and uniform, they will not be allowed to enter the class.

- Ragging is banned on the college campus. Anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging is liable to be punished as per the directives of the UGC and the Government. Any incident of ragging will be dealt with seriously, and the culprits will be dismissed from the institute, with a case filed at the local police station.
- Smoking and consuming alcohol on the institute's premises or entering the institute's premises after consuming alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited.
- Food and beverages are not permitted in computer labs, the library, reading rooms, and labs. They must be consumed in designated areas only.
- No person will be invited to address a meeting without the HOD's or Principal's approval.
- Limited staff and student parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis. The safety of vehicles parked on the property, including any damage, theft, or loss, is not the responsibility of the Institute administration.
- Students must enter and exit the campus in their vehicles at a moderate speed; exceeding this limit will be viewed as a breach of discipline and may result in negative consequences.
- Students are not permitted to indulge in political activities on campus and are prohibited from holding and attending political meetings within the institute.
- Students are expected to spend their free time in the library and must not loiter in the hallways or create crowds.
- Strict silence must be observed in the reading room, computer room, and library.
- Attendance of 80% or above is compulsory for appearing in

university exams. Students taking leave must obtain approval from class in-charges and submit their leave letter the previous day.

- If the academic performance of a student is not satisfactory, the student is likely to be detained and will not be allowed to appear for the examinations conducted by the institute on behalf of the university.
- Students shall not do anything within or outside the institute that hinders its conduct and discipline.
- Scribbling on desks is strictly prohibited and punishable.
- Students are obligated to treat members of the staff, whether on campus or off, with due respect.
- Students should treat fellow students with politeness and respect.
- No student shall collect any money or contribution for picnics, trips, educational visits, get-togethers, or any other activity without the prior sanction of the HOD or Principal.
- The use of cellular phones is strictly prohibited in classrooms and college corridors. Disciplinary action will be taken against students found carrying and/or using cell phones, pagers, walkmans, Discmans, iPods, etc.
- Students found guilty of non-conformity will be expelled from the classroom.
- Students are expected to treat institutional property with care and work with the administration to maintain the campus tidiness. Damage to institutional property, such as defacing walls, doors, fixtures, or furniture, misusing fixtures or furniture, misusing air conditioning, etc., is a breach of discipline, and offenders will face appropriate punishment.

- It is improper for students to leave their books, valuables, or other possessions in the classroom.
- Students should submit applications to the office for any certificates, testimonials, or anything else that requires the Principal's signature.
- Insubordination, offensive language, or other wrongdoing may be adequate grounds for suspending or dismissing a student.
- Students who cheat on exams will not be allowed to continue in the examination. Such students will be dealt with according to the university's policies and procedures.
- Students are responsible for frequently reading the notice boards for relevant announcements by the Institute administration. They will not receive any kind of pardon or concession because they were unaware of something or didn't read the notices.
